James Taylor a retired Peekskill Elementary School Principal, has combined his favorite avocations of the study of African-American history and woodworking into a masterful educational program entitled "A Bucket Full of History". Portraying a slave freed shortly after the Revolutionary War, who is a cooper by trade he tells the story of slavery in the Hudson Valley while demonstrating the making of a wooden bucket.

The story is captivating and information, highlighting the contributions of and the difficulties endured by enslaved Africans during the development of colonial America.
